

Esther Giles

Born in 1946, Tjurkula, Western Desert, Australia. Passed away in 2019.

BIOGRAPHY

Esther Giles grew up in the desert living the traditional nomadic lifestyle. After the death of her father, her family moved to the then newly established government settlement of Papunya. Like Tjawina Porter, Giles was known for her skills as a traditional basket weaver before becoming recognised for her painting.

Giles's artworks represent the traditional homelands associated with her people's ancestral heritage, her works are laden with symbolism. The iconography depicts sand dunes known as "tali" and rock escarpments known as "puli", as well as waterholes and food sources. Her designs are often used in body art during traditional ceremonies.

The artworks depict the physical markings that the ancient ancestors have provided to give evidence of their activities during the time of creation. Giles has gained worldwide recognition, participating in many national and international solo and group exhibitions. Her works are represented in private and public collections in Australia, Europe and the United States.
