

Olly Fathers

Born in 1987, Burton-upon-Trent. Lives in Brixton, London, United Kingdom.

BIOGRAPHY

Olly Fathers is an artist based in Brixton, London. His work explores the relationship between abstract shapes, geometry, materials, and three-dimensional forms - the result forming refined, often rather whimsical pieces that encourage contemplation. Upon further consideration, Fathers' works reveal to the viewer the extensive degree to which his process involves meticulous balance and precision. Fathers' attentiveness and detail-centric practice embodies the satisfaction obtained from the process of making, through a self-referential action which at once hints at both the maker and the product of his endeavours.

Fathers' process-oriented approach draws on woodwork both as a skillset and for its material utilitarianism in Art and Design fields the tradition of which has exerted an influence on his own process. Over the course of his career, Fathers' use of wood in his practice has grown and he now creates pieces using a variety of types and species. His paintings began initially as a simplified reference to observations he made watching the flow of traffic in urban environments. Through the application of paint, he replicated the essence of a public interaction with space, buildings, pathways, roads, and the navigation of other urban channels. Fathers' work has gradually become more refined, having meticulously developed his vision and self-taught marquetry techniques for well over a decade. Although his work has since adopted a cleaner, minimalist visual language compared to those of his earlier years, it maintains a resonance with the city landscape.

For JGM Gallery's *Tangram* showcase, Fathers' displayed works take inspiration from architecture and design, specifically early computer technologies and graphics. These pieces use intricately cut wood veneers which Fathers brings together using marquetry techniques. Exploring the visual language between simple forms and materials, Fathers manipulates independant shapes into a harmonious amalgam of forms, subsequently finding balance. He also makes works with paper, card, recycled cardboard, wood-effect vinyl, and other industrial materials. Many of these pieces he considers as studies for larger, future works, however, when lent the same gravitas as his paintings, defy their defintion as a preparatory stage. His work is collected and exhibited internationally and he also works on a commission basis.
