

Brenda Kesi

Born 1937, Enope Village, Oro Province, Papua New Guinea.

BIOGRAPHY

Brenda Kesi grew up during the turmoil of World War II, she also remembers the 1951 eruption of Dahore Huvaimo (Mount Lamington). Her mother was Go'ovino and her father was Valéla, both Ematé clans people from old Enopé village between the Jordan and Maruma Rivers. It was here that her mother taught her how to sew her grandmother, Munne's, sihoti'e taliobamë'e - designs of the mud. This method of appliquéing mud-dyed bark-cloth was first practiced by Suja, the first woman and mother of the world, as told in the Ömie creation story. Kesi has begun to teach her sister Teresa Kione (Avur'e) to sew the ancestral Ömie sihoti'e designs such as *wo'ohohe* (ground-burrowing spider) and *taigu taigu'e* (ancestral tattoo designs).

Kesi has exhibited extensively throughout Australia, Europe and the United States and is part of multiple public and private collections.
